Dec. 16 molested by Father John. Happened two years ago and proceeded. Santa Teresita knew two years ago. REDACTED REDACTED—three boys went to her two years ago and told her what had happened. She said it wasn't true. A week later she told the principal. She was going to call the authorities, but the Secretary, REDACTED told her to wait, that they would get help. Son is fifteen. Going on for one-and-a-half years and told parent last December. No sexual advances. Beginning. Camping. Woke up without pants on. Played with him. Made the boys touch him. Did this separately, but the boys told each other. He was teaching at school. One of the parents knows. REDACTED Mora. Other boy REDACTED does not want to say anything. Told her of situation, we had withdrawn faculties, order is inexperienced in these matters. Preliminary hearing 14 or 18th--latter I think. Admitted allegation, assigned public defender. Superior Court hearing. If not-guilty plea is made, then there will be a jury trial. John does not want to put the kids through this. Could not assure her that he would not be around kids, but that he would not have faculties, and that I understand the deep nature of such problems. January 15 is when the whole thing started. She is in contact with the other two parents, and I encouraged them to see me with a view to counseling.

Another boy called her son. Says Sister at St. Anthony de Padua told him not to say anything. Told her I talked to sister and that my main concern was for counseling-that thought sisters concern was that he not speak to other children.

at Chancery to meet with REDACTED 2/25/86 REDACTED office on Thu. REDACTED family has been calling up people. John is in hospital. The whole community knows about it. Trial is postponed till March 18.

No counseling yet. Has not talked to REDACTED 2/25/86 REDACTED Told her to contact me if I can help.

3/3/86 Met with REDACTED and daughter REDACTED (She goes to St. Matthias High School)

Gave them name of REDACTED and told them to be sure to contact him.

3/5/86 REDACTED Superior General here. Community knows. John responding to REDACTED who went to see him. Suggested they should keep the public defender until they find out more. Hearing will be the 18th.

3/26/86 Last hearing postponed until April 1st. John has been in hospital. Has been allowed out a few times. May attend some to the sessions with REDACTED

3/27/86 Talked to REDACTED Counseling for her son and both parents OK. Heard Father John was at school last Tuesday and that Father REDACTED had told her that Father John would be doing community service and that she should ignore him. Talked to Father REDACTED Therapist had told them it would be good to have Father John in therapy with community. Told him of danger of rumors, misinterpretation. Not to have Father around at all. That I would find a meeting place if needed.

4/2/86 Father REDACTED Closed hearing yesterday. Lawyer from Chancery there but REDACTED not allowed to be at hearing. Good hearing--only public defender. Going to Superior Court. Probably will be plea bargaining if families don't press charges. Plea--if families don't press charges, he might be on probation. One of the families brought their own lawyer. REDACTED family brought lawyer. Next hearing 16th of April.

REDACTED Lawyer told him that letter of recommendation would be good for John.

4/10/85 Talked to REDACTED Let him know REDACTED did not want to talk to him. He knows and will not call. Told him about Sister REDACTED concerns that kids were talking, and also parents. He and I felt a meeting would only open up all kinds of problems. Told him I would call Sister.

Talked to him re REDACTED allegations that John Salazar suspended her youngest boy because he did not want to be an altar boy. Told him I would talk to Sister REDACTED about this.

4/17/86 Arraignment yesterday. Pre-trial for 28th of May. REDACTED was there. DA says that there is something else. The families trusted him as a priest, and he took advantage of their trust. Does not mean that charges can't be dropped. The public defender is a very good person. He will talk to the DA and do as much as he can. Abuse of trust is one of them [the charges]. Mr. REDACTED is aware of this and will be very attentive to this. REDACTED will call him and me later. According to law, no one can get a transcript except when the trial is over.

5/13/86 Talked to REDACTED Told he to wait until after the hearing, that even then I saw difficulties in meeting with people openly. She said two sets of parents whose boys are not involved are the main promoters of this. Talked to her about REDACTED boy. See notes in Salazar file.

(Re John Salazar)

John-did not do reports and John increased work until it was 500 words, and he still did not do it. At that stage, Sister took over and suspended him. She talked to the other school but does not think she mentioned suspension though she mentioned that the parents did not support the boy or the school.

5/29/86 Postponed till June 30. Reports not finished. DA on vacation, public defender also out. June 30.

6/4/86 Saw John Salazar. Spoke to me for more than an hour. Is facing up to the difficulties in his life. His mother a great problem. Says he is closer to his family than ever before. Does not think he wants to continue with Order but wants to minister in some way in the L. A. Archdiocese. Says he feels closer to Archdiocese than he does to Order.

6/6/86 Talked to REDACTED Told her I had talked to sister and that she was aware of her other son's suspension and that it was not because he did not wish to be an altarboy.

Told her I saw Fr. Sohn (she asked how he was) that he was still in hospital and that he was facing up to the problems in his life—that no one could be more angry at him than he was at himself. She thanked me for the call. Said that they had changed parishes and that the other boy cannot get into school.

7/1/86 REDACTED Postponed again because one of the psychologists appointed by the Court did not turn in his report because he wants more money.

Postponed until July 29,

John will stay in the hospital. This is on the advice of the public defender.

11/19/86 John Salazar. Met with him. He is doing well. Told him that there was no real possibility of faculties for the present in L.A. He seemed devastated. Mentioned the possibility of a

residence for him, and told him I would continue to work with him.

12/2/86 Called REDACTED today. John found it very hard, but understands. Told him I would help, even to the extent of finding a place in a rectory. Told him John could come to see me.

# MEMORANDUM FROM REDACTED

Date: February 12, 1986

Yesterday, a REDACTED called the School Department to report that Rev. John Salazar. Sch.P. had sexually molested her boy over a period of time. I met with REDACTED this morning. Her son is now 15 years old and going to Cantwell School. However, the incidents took place while he was a student at Santa Teresita School. They occurred on a camping trip and while he was staying at Casa Calasanz.

REDACTED claims there were two other boys involved. She also said that the authorities at the school knew of this, but did not report it. She was aware that Father Salazar had been sent for counseling to REDACTED REDACTED add report this to the authorities, and there has been action taken and, according to REDACTED there will be a court hearing within the next few weeks. Her concern was that Father Salazar be removed from all possible contacts with school or with young boys.

I spoke to REDACTED and he confirmed that he was seeing Father Salazar and that he had reported the incidents to the police. Father Salazar is in a psychiatric hospital, but REDACTED could not give me its name and referred me to Father REDACTED the Superior. Asked if he thought there was substance to REDACTED account, he said he could not answer that, but was taking it very seriously.

I found REDACTED calm, reasonable, and concerned. I assured her that I would be in touch with Father Salazar's superiors right away and also that I would look into the possibility of counseling assistance for her son and the youths involved. REDACTED says that some of the families are traumatized and are definitely in need of help, and that he hopes the religious order involved will look towards assisting these adolescents.

I have not yet been able to reach REDACTED but will continue to try. I propose to tell him that the Archdiocese is withdrawing faculties from Father Salazar immediately, pending further investigation of the case.

Father, I think I have probably gone as far as necessary. REDACTED is going to handle the case all the way through the trial courts and I consider him well able to do a good job. The main thing is he seems to have a compassionate approach and is interested in the case. He had read the transcript of the preliminary hearing and I notice that he had underlined certain parts of it so he will not be unprepared when the case finally gets to serious negotiations or trial.

I would like to offer you some advice: I think you should have Father Salizar obtain from REDACTED ) a copy of the transcript of the hearing that took place at the court session in East Los Angeles. That is where the boys testified. I think you should have that to make your own

Dear Friends,

My name is Fr. REDACTED , provincial delegate of the Calasanzian Fathers (The Piarists) and I am writing this letter in behalf of Fr. John Salazar a member of our religious community. I am well aware that you are informed about his situation and take this opportunity to thank you for your strong love and support.

John has been in the hospital since the first week of February and is doing well. I believe that John has done much work and faced many problems that have been strong burdens in his life. I am sure that you, like I, believe that John deserves all the help and support he can get. It is at this time that I on behalf of John and our religious community would like to ask for your help. On May 28th John will appear at superior court and is in dire need of Character Reference letters to be presented to the judge so probation will be granted instead of jail time.

I am sure that you will agree with me that John does not deserve jail time and you can help us by writing this very important letter on his behalf. Here is an outline/idea of the letter that we are asking for.

- 1. Use personal, church, business letterhead
- 2. can be typed or hand written
- 3. can be in Spanish or English
- 4. address letter: To whom it may concern
- 5. Introduce yourself, position, how long have you known John and in what capacity (friend, family, priest, teacher, classmate etc...)
- 6. What are John's strenghs and talents
- 7. What has John personally done for you that has impressed you, helped you
- 8. Other important things that could be of help to convey to the judge that John is a good person.

Please keep this letter and all information that you know about John and his situation CONFIDENTIAL. Please destroy this letter that I am sending you after you have written your letter. When you have completed your letter please mail it to me at:

I believe he has made very significant progress.

The Archdiocese will do its best to support him and his community.

I saw John recently (the Piarist priest accused of child abuse). His trial has been repeatedly postponed, but he thinks it will probably come up at the end of December. His lawyer is increasingly optimistic about the possibility of parole.

He wanted very much to know about serving in the Archdiocese in the future and almost insisted on an answer. I told him that I could see no possibility of him getting the faculties of the Archdiocese within the foreseeable future. This was devastating to him, but he did understand the reasons, and his superior, Father REDACTED has told me that he has accepted this.

In talking to John and to Father REDACTED, I emphasized that while we could not grant faculties, we would be willing to help, even to the extent of looking for a residence at some parish or convent while he was settling into another job. Both he and Father REDACTED will probably come to see me soon again about this. However, everything is very tentative until after the court hearing.

Meantime, the community is most grateful for the generous donation from the Archdiocese.

Indeed they will probably not even try another postponement as it will just go on and on.



# Priest gets 6-year prison term for molesting two altar boys

By Nancy Hill-Holtzman Herald staff writer

A 31-year-old Catholic priest was sentenced to six years in state prison yesterday for molesting two altar boys at St. Lucy's Catholic Church in East Los Angeles.

The Rev. John Anthony Salazar admitted to orally copulating a 14-year-old boy and fondling a 13-year-old boy when he pleaded guilty to two felony counts in May, Deputy District Attorney Kenneth Wullschleger said. The molestations occurred between November 1984 and June 1985.

According to Wullschleger, Salazar, who taught at Santa Teresita School in the City Terrace area, molested the boys when he had them over to spend the night in his living quarters on the church grounds.

"He often told them he was doing a sexual survey," Wullschleger said. Later, the priest told authorities he "thought he was in low with the boys," the prosecu-

A spokesman for the archdiocese declined comment, referring the matter to an attorney, who could not be reached late yesterday.

Four additional felony charges and two misdemeanors involving three other boys were dismissed as part of a plea bargain after the victims, who had

testified against the priest at a prelimir nary hearing, asked to withdraw from the case, Wullschleger said.

The mothers of the alleged victims dropped from the case joined a group of more than 100 letter-writers in urging Superior Court Judge Michael Burke not to send the 10-year veteran priest to prison.

The defense proposed sending Salazar; to Villa Louis Martin, a New Mexico facility for troubled priests where and Orange County priest was sent last year; as a condition of probation for molesting an altar boy. William Monroe was the attorney for both priests, Wullschleger, said.

But Burke, relying in part on a 90-day prison diagnostic exam that recommended state prison, refused the request, going beyond the three-year terms sought by the prosecution.

Wullschleger said the study concluded that Salazar was a pedophile who had "a rather sad background" of being molested by his mother as a child.

Salazar, who checked himself into a residential psychiatric facility for nine months after his arrest, wept throughout yesterday's court session, according to Wullschleger.

The priest's attitude about his actions changed "drastically" over the course of the criminal case. Wullschleger said. "It never saw someone so open in admitting his problem," he said.

I think you should know that, earlier today I was called by the secretary of Fr. Sergio Negro, Vicar General of the Diocese of Fresno, with an inquiry about Father John Salazar, a priest of your Diocese. She had received an inquiry from a REDACTED whose sister also lives in your Diocese.

REDACTED was seeking to verify if Father John Salazar-Jimenez, pastor of Holy Spirit Parish, in Tulia, Texas, was the same Father John Salazar who had at one time been a Piarist Father. It seems her sister has grave concerns about Father Salazar-Jimenez's behavior, citing the altar servers do not want to serve Mass with him. She was inquiring if it was true that he had a history in California of problems with minors.

In case you are not aware of the history in this case, I have attached a copy of Cardinal Mahony's letter of October 23, 1991, to your predecessor, Bishop Matthiesen.

I thought you should be aware that there is concern over this priest's behavior and that inquiries are being made into his past. I advised Father Negro's secretary to encourage the woman involved to contact your office directly.

It is my sad duty to write to you to pass along a report about Father John Salazar, a former member of your community. REDACTED spoke with his pastor, Father REDACTED of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, Sun Valley. Father REDACTED contacted me.

As you know, Father Salazar was arrested, convicted of misconduct and sentenced in the 1980's. As you also know, he left the Piarists and was incardinated into the Diocese of Amarillo, Texas. Currently, he has been removed from ministry.



On and between January 1, 1980 and December 31, 1982, in the County of Los Angeles, the crime of ORAL COPULATION OF A PERSON UNDER 18, in violation of PENAL CODE SECTION 288a(b)(1), a Felony, was committed by JOHN ANTHONY SALAZAR, who did unlawfully participate in an act of oral copulation with REDACTED a person under the age of eighteen years.

### Last Jailed Priest in **County Is Released**

As court ruling's effects unfold, the D.A. vows to press an inquiry into alleged sex abuses by clergy.

AND RICHARD WINTON Times Staff Writers

The only priest still jailed while awaiting trial in Los Angeles on child molestation charges was released Monday as the county's top prosecutor vowed to press forward with his investigation of alleged wrongdoing in the Roman Catholic Church.

"This is not over by any means," Dist. Atty. Steve Cooley said Monday. "The fat lady hasn't sung yet."

"There is no doubt there was a huge moral institutional failing and personal moral failing," Cooley said. "Whether that amounts to criminal culpability remains to be seen. We don't have the facts yet."

Across California, prosecutors struggled Monday with the legal ramifications of a controversial U.S. Supreme Court ruling that prohibits prosecution in decades-old child molestation offenses. The decision affects about 800 cases statewide, involving people who have been convicted, who have confessed or who have charges pending. About 200 cases are in Los Angeles County.

Prosecutors are finding an average of about 10 cases per county in California that are affected by the ruling, said Nancy O'Malley, head of the sexual assault committee of the California District Attorneys Assn.

Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge David Horwitz ordered former priest Carlos Rene Rodriguez released from County Jail, pending a court appearance July 9.

■ Superior Court Commissioner Jeffrey Harkavy said he probably would dismiss child molestation charges against John Anthony Salazar on Wednesday.

■ In Ventura County, a judge dismissed molestation charges against retired priest Carl Sutphin.

In each case, judges cited the U.S. Supreme Court decision.



In Rodriguez's case, Deputy Los Angeles County Public Defender Arthur C. Braudrick said he expects the case to be dismissed, probably on a motion by the prosecution.

Rodriguez, 46, of Commerce, was charged with molesting an altar boy from 1985 to 1987 when he served at St. Vincent de Paul Church. Rodriguez has been in jail since September, awaiting trial. His bail was \$400,000.

Salazar's case is expected to be dismissed Wednesday with the defendant's having to return to court, unless the district attorney's office decides to try to continue prosecuting him, the court commissioner said.

Salazar was charged last No-

vember with molesting a youth at the rectory house at St. Bernard High School in Playa del Ray

"It's a kick in the head," said Carlos Perez-Carillo, 37, the complaining witness in the Salazar case. "T've been in therapy for a year, and I feel like I'm back to square one," he said. "The criminal case would have been priceless for me, because I would have received justice and there would have been a message sent out to people who molest children that they were not going to get away with that."

In Ventura County, the charges against Sutphin, 71, were dismissed at the request of the district attorney's office.

Sutphin was accused of molesting six boys, ages 7 to 12, between 1968 and 1978 while he was an associate pastor at a Camarillo church and a chaplain at an Oxnard hospital.

Saying that those who claimed to have been attacked by Sutphin are extremely disappointed "doesn't even come close to describing the emotions they are feeling right now," Deputy Dist. Atty. Doug Ridley said outside the courtroom. "It's a sad day for victims of child molestation in this state and in this county."

Sutphin, who had pleaded not guilty, had tears in his eyes after Judge James Cloninger granted the dismissal, said defense lawyer James Farley.

In San Diego, authorities have said that they would seek the dismissal of charges against a retired San Diego priest accused of molesting a 15-year-old church worker in the late 1970s. The priest, Franklyn Becker, was

arrested in May 2002 in Mayville, Wis., and was to be extradited to California next week. The California attorney general's office has decided not to pursue extradition, said Peter Quon, deputy attorney general in San Diego.

As prosecutors, defense attorneys and state corrections officials struggled with the aftermath of the Supreme Court decision, the non-criminal claims against priests continued to advance in court.

Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge Marvin Lager, who is overseeing hundreds of claims against the Catholic Church, Monday agreed to let lawyers for alleged victims issue subpoenas

to priests accused of molesting children.

There was concern that accused priests would leave the country as their criminal cases were dismissed to try to avoid being deposed in the civil litigation, said Venus Soltan, a Costa Mesa attorney. Soltan has filed 30 suits against the dioceses in Southern California and is expected to file at least 20 more.

Once subpoenaed, if they flee, "we can have an order of attachment issued to bring them back to the state of California," said Beverly Hills attorney Raymond P. Boucher, who represents more than 200 alleged victims of sexual abuse by priests. "It significantly limits their ability to hide."

Lager also granted a request by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to halt all other proceedings, at least until the next court hearing on July 17.

Cooley is scheduled to meet today with his top managers and prosecutors to decide how to proceed on the 200 child molestation cases affected by the ruling.

"These cases involve not only priests, but doctors, fathers, boyfriends and Scout leaders," Cooley said.

A pending ruling by a retired judge on whether prosecutors are entitled to more than 2,000 pages of church communications may be key to that decision. Cooley's office is seeking the information through a grand jury subpoena. Lawyers for Mahony and individual priests are fighting to keep them secret.

West Texas priest accused of sexual assault By Domingo Ramirez Jr. Star-Telegram Staff Writer

IRVING - A Dallas County grand jury will consider a case in which a West Texas priest convicted in the 1980s of molesting children has been accused of sexually assaulting a teen-ager at a motel in September.

A decision by the grand jury is expected this month, authorities said.

The Rev. John Salazar, who has not worked as a parish priest since April 2002, is accused of sexually assaulting an 18-year-old Amarillo man at an Irving motel Sept. 21 after a wedding.

The grand jury received the case after Irving police investigated, authorities said.

The teen and Salazar had been friends for more than five years, family members said.

The teen's mother, REDACTED of Tulia, said the family did not know about Salazar's criminal record.

"We had no idea what he was all about, "REDACTED said. "This all just sickens me."

Salazar could not be reached to comment Friday.

His attorney, REDACTED indictment.

said he didn't expect the grand jury to return an

"This all is very unfortunate," REDACTED said Friday. "But this one doesn't sound like the real deal. There could be a monetary motive for bringing such an allegation."

-Salazar was sentenced to prison in the 1980s for molesting two teen-agers in Los Angeles, according to an official with the Amarillo Diocese.

He was ordained as a priest in Los Angeles after he got out of prison and was hired as a priest in Texas in 1991. He remained at the Church of the Holy Spirit in Tulia until 2002. There, the teen's family members said, he befriended the teen and his family.

Salazar was forced to resign in April 2002 because a new Catholic Church policy required priests accused of sexual misconduct to be removed, said REDACTED a spokeswoman for the Amarillo Diocese.

He was not allowed to celebrate Mass or perform any ministerial duties after his resignation,  $^{\mbox{\tiny REDACTED}}$  said.

Salazar told the  $\frac{\text{REDACTED}}{\text{family that he had}}$  to leave the church because he had some trouble with a woman in the 1980s,  $\frac{\text{REDACTED}}{\text{said}}$ .

"We kept in contact even after he left the church," REDACTED said. "He had dinner with us a couple of times."

The family even paid for Salmar's room at the Days Inn in Ir. ing on the weekend of the wedding.

"He knew everyone in the family, so I wasn't surprised to see him," REDACTED said.

According to an Irving police report, the teen became ill early on Sept. 21.

At some point that morning, a man invited the teen into a motel room, where the teen was sexually assaulted, the police report said.

### Abuse Ruling Spares Judge, Priest

C hild molestation charges were dismissed Wednesday against former Orange County Superior Court Judge Ronald C. Kline, following last week's Supreme Court ruling overturning a California law that had allowed prosecution of decades old sex crimes.

Also Wednesday, a former priest became the first Los Angeles County defendant to have his molestation charges dropped, also because of the high-court ruling.

Kline's lawyer, Paul Meyer, asked the court to drop the case, which involved allegations that the former judge orally copulated a 14-year-old boy in 1979.

The case had been on hold pending the outcome of federal child pornography possession charges also filed against the former jurist. Kline, 62, did not appear in court for the hearing.


Los Angeles Superior Court Judge Daniel Pratt in the Norwalk courthouse granted the motion, dismissing six felony counts.

"We pled not guilty from Day One in this case," Meyer said after the hearing.

"In all the hoopla about the Supreme Court [decision], let's not forget the presumption of innocence," Meyer added. "I am satisfied that Judge Kline would have been acquitted at trial."

A spokeswoman for the Orange County district attorney's office, which prosecuted the Kline case, said that the office had to obey the Supreme Court decision, which made the extension of the statute of limitations in certain sex crimes unconstitutional.

Meanwhile, at the downtown Los Angeles Criminal Justice Center, Superior Court Commissioner Jeffrey Harkayay dismissed the case of Anthony Salazar a

47-year-old former priest who allegedly sexually molested a male student and an altar boy nearly two decades ago.

Neither Salazar nor his attorney was present for the hearing.

A statement from the Los Angeles district attorney's office said that this was the first case from that office to be dismissed following the court's decision.

According to the California District Attorneys Association, 800 cases statewide likely will be aborted or overturned in wake of the Supreme Court's decision, including 200 to 250 in Los Angeles. The court threw out the law used in their prosecutions, which had allowed sexual-abuse charges to be brought after the statute of limitations

expired.

A handful of other priests and other molestation defendants have been released throughout the state because of the high-court decision.

Kline was up for re-election last year when federal prosecutors charged him with child pornography possession following a tip from a Canadian man who illegally hacked into Kline's home computer. Those charges quickly were followed by allegations from a 37-year-old man that Kline had molested him. The teen allegedly was 14, and Kline in his mid-to-late 30s, at the time.

Kline, who pleaded not guilty to all charges, was allowed to withdraw from a November runoff election.

In Kline's federal case, U.S. District Judge Consuelo Marshall earlier this year threw out key evidence, ruling that the hacker was working as a law enforcement informant when he allegedly found hundreds of pictures of naked boys and a personal diary on Kline's home computer. A hearing is set for Sept. 15 on whether evidence found on Kline's countliouse computer also will be thrown out.

Meyer declined to comment on the pending federal case.

Salazar, who resigned in May from the Amarillo, Texas, diocese, was charged in November with one count of oral copulation of a person younger than 18 and one count of oral copulation of a person younger than 16. The statute of limitations in those cases expired in 1985 and 1986, the district attorney's office said.

Following last week's Supreme Court ruling nullifying California's 1994 retroactive change in the statute of limitations, any case concerning sexual molestations that took place before Jan. 1, 1988, is barred from prosecution.

### First Former Priest in Los Angeles Has Sex Abuse Charges Dropped

(AP)—Molestation charges against a former Roman Catholic priest were dismissed yesterday because of the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling against a California law that allowed prosecution of old sex abuse cases in which the statute of limitation had expired.

The case against sonn Anthony Salazar 41, was the first such prosecution in Los Angeles County to be

dropped because of the high court decision.

Salazar was charged with two counts of oral copulation for allegedly molesting a student and an altar boy in the early 1980s. He did not appear for the brief proceeding in which Superior Court Commissioner Jeffrey Harkavy approved a dismissal motion by the district attorney's office.

Irene Wakabayashi, assistant chief of the district attorney's sex crimes unit, said the prosecutions of 10 priests and a seminarian were being reviewed "on a case-by-case basis" but Salazar was given priority because he

had been due for a pretrial hearing yesterday.

She said the dismissal was required in response to last week's U.S. Supreme Court decision invalidating California's 1994 extension of the statute of limitations on molestations.

The law prompted by victims who came forward belatedly, had brought a flood of allegations including those against priests. District Attorney Steve Cooley has said that some 200 molestation cases will have to be dropped.

Salazar resigned as a priest in May from the Amarillo, Texas, diocese. The charges against him involved allegations when he was assigned to St. Bernard High School and Santa Teresita Church in Los Angeles.

### Former Priest Charged With Molestation to be Released

(CNS)—A former priest accused of child molestation was ordered released from jail yesterday in light of a U.S. Supreme Court ruling striking down a law allowing for prosecution of old sex crimes.

Los Angeles Superior Court Judge David Horwitz ordered Carlos Rene Rodriguez who has been in custody for about nine months—released on his own recognizance.

It's unclear when the release processing procedure would be completed and Rodriguez freed, said defense attorney Arthur Braudrick.

Rodriguez, 46, is due back in court July 9, when prosecutors are expected to announce whether they will oppose the case being dismissed.

Rodriguez's lawyer told reporters outside court that he fully expects the case to be dismissed then—likely on the prosecution's own motion.

"Mr. Rodriguez wants to get out of jail, live his life and put all this behind him," Braudrick said,

Rodriguez is the third former priest to be ordered released from jail on his own recognizance in connection with the Supreme Court's ruling

Last week, former priests Michael Wempe and Lawrence Joseph Lovell were ordered teleased frim Jall as a result of the high court's fulling. Their cases are due back in court July 8 and July 11, respectively.

Meanwhile, also yesterday, Los Angeles Superior Court Commissioner Jeffrey Harkayy said he will likely grant the defense's motion to dismiss the case against another former priest, John Anthony Salazar.

The commissioner gave the prosecution two days to evaluate its options in light of the high court's ruling.

Salazar was escorted out a back exit of the downtown Los Angeles courthouse by sheriff's deputies Angeles

Salazar, Rodriguez, Wempe and Lovell are among 10 former priests recently charged in connection with chilld molestation cases, with charges against one dating back to the 1940s.

Two priests already have been ordered to stand trial; others are awaiting similar hearings or extradition from other states of Canada.

Besides the former priests, prosecutors have filed criminal charges against a former seminary student accused of molesting two boys in the 1980s.

Several other potential cases remain under investigation by the Los Angeles Police and Sheaff's departments and other agencies in Los Angeles County, according to officials with the District Attorney's Office

After the Supreme Court's ruling last week, District Attorney Steve Cooley said his office will review more than 200 eases that might be affected.

### Last Jailed Priest in County Is Released

As court ruling's effects unfold, the D.A. vows to press an inquiry into alleged sex abuses by clergy.

The only priest still jailed, while awaiting trial in Los Angeles on child molestation charges was released Monday as the county's top prosecutor vowed to press forward with his

investigation of alleged wrongdoing in the Roman Catholic Church.

"This is not over by any means," Dist. Atty. Steve Cooley said Monday. "The fat lady hasn't sung yet."

"There is no doubt there was a huge moral institutional failing and personal moral failing," Cooley said. "Whether that amounts to criminal culpability remains to be seen. We don't have the facts yet."

Across California, prosecutors struggled Monday with the legal ramifications of a controversial U.S. Supreme Court rulying that prohibits prosecution in decades old child molestation offenses. The decision affects about 800 cases statewide, involving people who have been convicted, who have confessed or who have charges pending. About 200 cases are in Los Angeles County.

Prosecutors are finding an average of about 10 cases per county in California that are affected by the ruling, said Nancy O'Malley, head of the sexual assault committee of the California District Attorneys Assn.

In other developments Monday:

■ Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge David Horwitz ordered former priess Carlos Rene Rodriguez released from County July pending a court appearance July 9.



Rodriguez, 46, of Commerce, was charged with molesting an altar boy from 1985 to 1987 when he served at St. Vincent de Paul Church. Rodriguez has been in jail since September, awaiting trial. His bail was \$400,000.

Salazar's case is expected to be dismissed Wednesday with the defendant's having to return to court, unless the district attorney's office decides to try to continue prosecuting him, the court commissioner said.

Salazar was charged last No-

vember with molesting a youth at the rectory house at St. Berhard High School in Playa del Ray

"It's a kick in the head," said Carlos Perez-Carillo, 37, the complaining witness in the Salazar case. Twe been in therapy for a year, and I feel like I'm back to square one," he said. "The criminal case would have been priceless for me, because I would have received justice and there would have been a message sent out to people who molest children that they were not going to get away with that."

In Ventura County, the charges against Sutphin, 71, were dismissed at the request of the district attorney's office.

Sutphin was accused of molesting six boys, ages 7 to 12, between 1968 and 1978 while he was an associate pastor at a Camarillo church and a chaplain at an Oxnard hospital.

Saying that those who claimed to have been attacked by Sutphin are extremely disappointed, "doesn't even come close to describing the emotions they are feeling right now," Deputy Dist. Atty. Doug Ridley said outside the courtroom. "It's a sad day for victims of child molestation in this state and in this country."

Sutphin, who had pleaded not guilty, had tears in his eyes after Judge James Cloninger granted the dismissal, said detense lawyer James Farley.

In San Diego, authorities have said that they would seek the dismissal of charges against a retired San Diego priest accused of molesting a 15-year-old church worker in the late 1970s. The priest, Franklyn Becker, was

arrested in May 2002 in Mayville, Wis, and was to be extradited to California next week. Thie California attorney general's office has decided not to pursue extradition, said Peter Quon, deputy attorney general in San Diego.

As prosecutors, defense attorneys and state corrections officials struggled with the aftermath of the Supreme Court decision, the non-oriminal claims against priests continued to advance in court.

Los Angeles County Superior Court Judge Marvin Lager, who is overseeing hundreds of claims against the Catholic Church, Monday agreed to let lawyers for alleged victims issue subpoenas to priests accused of molesting

There was concern that accused priests would leave the country as their criminal cases were dismissed to try to avoid being deposed in the civil litigation, said Venus Soltan, a Costa Mesa attorney. Soltan has filed 30 suits against the dioceses in Southern California and is expected to file at least 20 more.

Once subpoenaed, if they fiee, "we can have an order of attachment issued to bring them back to the state of California," said Beverly Hills attorney Raymond P. Boucher, who represents more than 200 alleged victims of sexual abuse by priests. "It significantly limits their ability to hide."

Lager also granted a request by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to halt all other proceedings, at least until the next court hearing on July 17.

Cooley is scheduled to meet today with his top managers and prosecutors to decide how to proceed on the 200 child mojestation cases affected by the rul-
